A message from the principal



This month, I accepted an invitation to attend the 3rd Annual Education Conference hosted by The Emirates Center for Strategic Studies and Research. This year's theme was: Information Technology and the Future of Education in the United Arab Emirates. The opening was delivered by H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum who

spoke of his vision for the Emirates and the need for technology in our schools to build upon the success of the UAE. His vision in the global education market is not alone.

The day prior to this event we had a very successful Open House event where we worked on educating our parents on the difference between formative and summative assessment. Questions such as "What is this going to look like in the classrooms?" "How will my child earn a grade?" "What if they are not learning?" All excellent questions.

The big question is:

"Will my child have the skills necessary to compete in 21st Century?"

I will ask you to reflect on what skills you need for your job currently? Technology, communication, problem solving, critical thinking, and multi-tasking.
